



BROKER DISCLOSURE TO NON-RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS

Prior to negotiating on your behalf the Broker must provide you the following disclosure statement:

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BROKER DISCLOSURE TO CUSTOMERS ker is either an agent of another party in the transaction or a subagent of another broker who is the agent of another party in the transaction. The broker, or a salesperson acting on behalf of the broker, may provide 5 brokerage services to you. Whenever the broker is providing brokerage services to you, the broker owes you, the customer, the following duties:

- The duty to provide brokerage services to you fairly and honestly.
- The duty to exercise reasonable skill and care in providing brokerage services to you.
- The duty to provide you with accurate information about market conditions with a reasonable time if you request it, unless disclosure of the information is prohibited by law.
- 11 The duty to disclose to you in writing certain material adverse facts about a property, unless disclosure of the information is 12 prohibited by law (See Lines 47-55).
- 13 The duty to protect your confidentiality. Unless the law requires it, the broker will not disclose your confidential information or the 14 confidential information of other parties (See Lines 22-39).

DEFINITION OF MATERIAL ADVERSE FACTS 452.01 (5g) as an adverse fact that a party indicates is of such significance, or that 48 lacktrianglee as being of such significance to a reasonable party, that it affects or would affect the party's decision to enter into a contract or agreement concerning a transaction or affects or would affect the party's decision 51 about the terms of such a contract or agreement. An "adverse fact" is defined in Wis. Stat. § 452.01 (1e) as a condition or occurrence that a competent licensee generally recognizes will significantly and adversely affect the value of the property, significantly reduce the structural integrity of improvements to real estate, or present a significant health risk to occupants of the property; or information that indicates that a party to a transaction is not able to or does not intend to meet his or her obligations under a contract or agreement made concerning the transaction.
