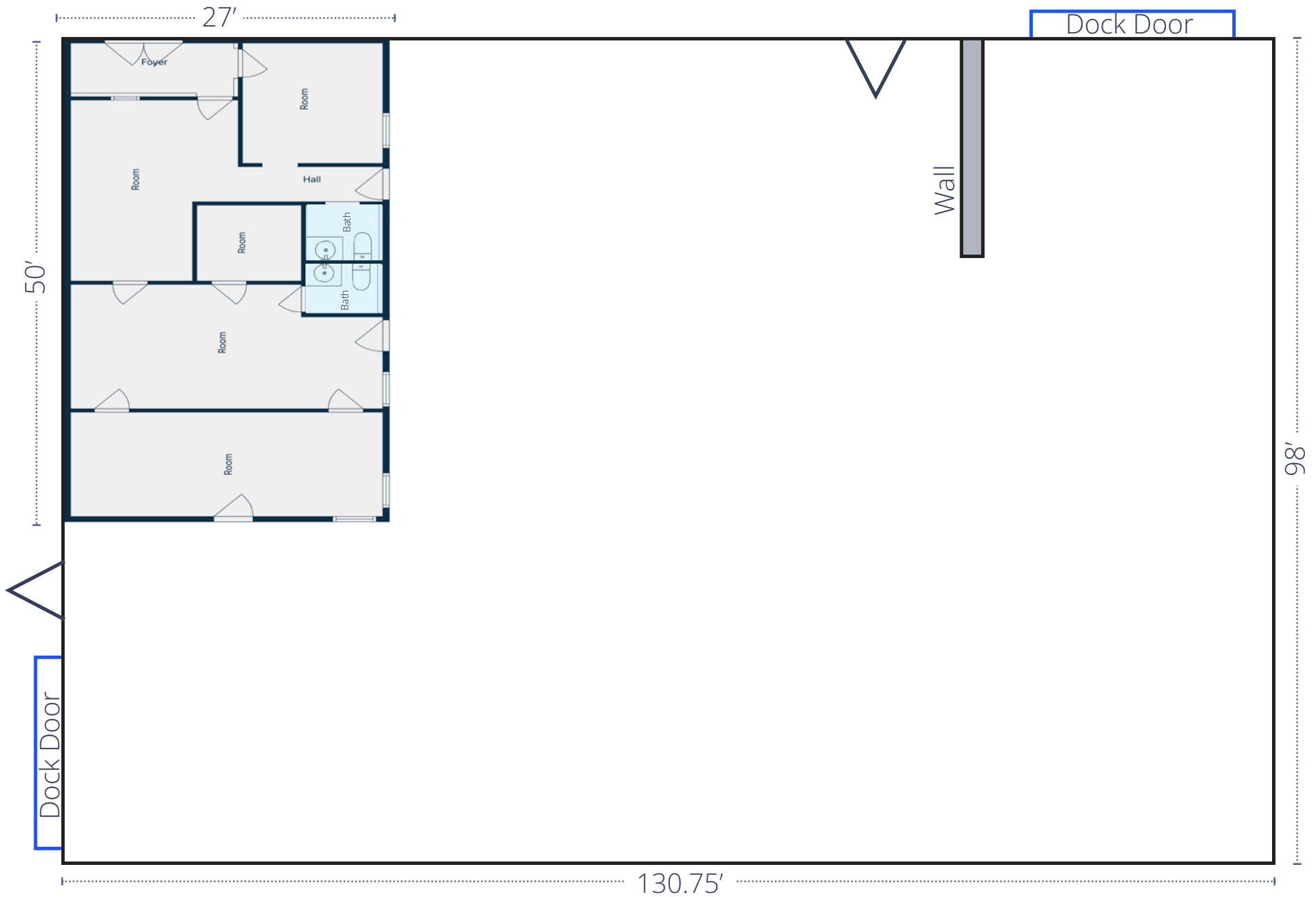

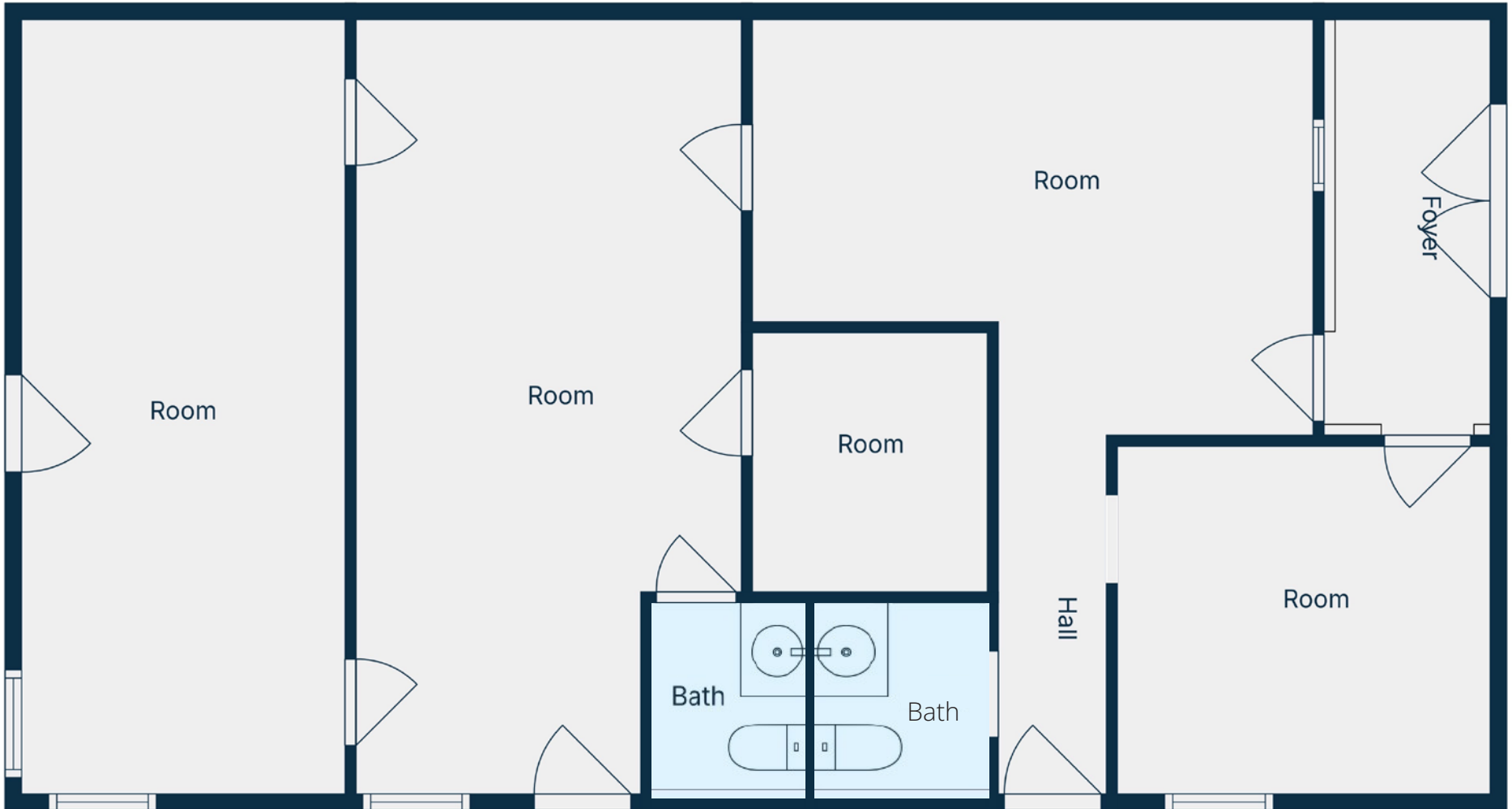
Floor Plan

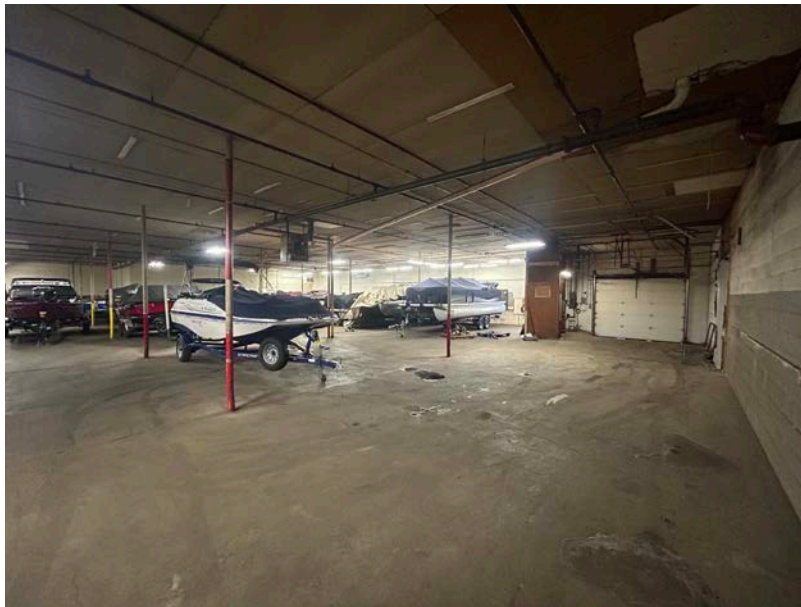
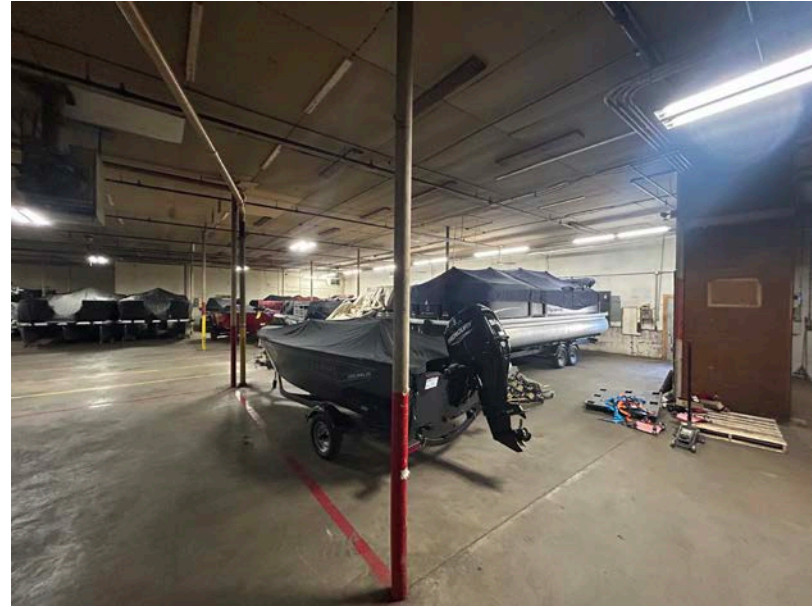
Office Floor Plan
